Meet Our Director

Drew Carter

Drew Carter has been the director of the Charlotte Concert Band since the fall of 2012. He is also director of bands at Cox Mill High School in Concord. Previously, he was the band director at CC Griffin Middle School and assistant director of bands at Central Cabarrus High School.

Prior to his appointments in Cabarrus County, he held the position of Director of Bands at Chapel Hill High School in Chapel Hill, NC from 2005-2010. There, his responsibilities included directing the Concert Band, Symphonic Band, Percussion Ensemble, Jazz Band, Marching Band, and Pit Orchestra, in addition to overseeing the jazz combo program.

During his tenure at CHHS, the concert and marching bands, as well as the percussion ensemble, received numerous Superior ratings at District Music Performance Adjudication (MPA) events in Levels IV, V, and VI. The CHHS jazz program was honored at the 33rd Annual "Essentially Ellington" High School Jazz Festival at UNC in February 2010 as being the "Outstanding Jazz Band" and the "Outstanding Combo," receiving an invitation to perform with the acclaimed North Carolina Jazz Repertory Orchestra as a result.

Prior to teaching at CHHS, Mr. Carter was the Director of Bands at West Alexander Middle School in Taylorsville, NC from 2003-2005, where his teaching responsibilities included Beginning Band, Intermediate Band, Advanced Band, Jazz Band, and Percussion Ensemble. While in Alexander County, Mr. Carter remained an active performer with the Unifour Brass, the Hickory Choral Society, and the Lenoir-Rhyne Concert Band.

Mr. Carter received his Bachelor of Arts in Music (horn performance) from University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 2000. He received his Master of Arts in Teaching from UNC-CH in 2001. His professional affiliations include the National Association for Music Education, the North Carolina Music Educators Association, and the South Central District Bandmasters Association. His bands have twice performed at the NC Music Educators Association Convention: in 2015 (CCB) and in 2019 (JRMHS). He was inducted into the American School Band Directors Association (ASBDA) in 2017. He is married to his wonderful and supportive wife of seventeen years, Mandy, and they live in Cabarrus County with their sons, Van and Levi.



Meet Dr. Hunter Kopczynski



Hunter Kopczynski serves as director of bands and assistant professor of music at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, where he conducts the UNC Charlotte Wind Ensemble, teaches courses in conducting and music education, and conducts and administers the Charlotte Youth Wind Ensembles.

Dr. Kopczynski comes to Charlotte after holding similar positions at Mars Hill University and in the public schools of Virginia. At MHU, he coordinated the band program, conducted the wind symphony, and taught courses in the department of music. Additionally, he served as conductor of the Asheville Symphony Youth Orchestra. Before his time in Asheville, Kopczynski completed his graduate degrees at Michigan State University, where he held instructional and musical responsibilities with each of the concert and athletic bands and served the Graduate School as a Leadership Fellow. Prior to graduate study, he taught middle and high school music in Virginia. There he successfully led high school and middle school bands in the Roanoke County Schools and most recently for six years in the Williamsburg-James City County Schools.

Kopczynski earned the Doctor of Musical Arts and Master of Music degrees in Wind Conducting from Michigan State University. He also completed a Master of Arts in Education and a Bachelor of Arts *summa cum laude* in Music from Virginia Tech. His principal conducting teachers were Kevin L. Sedatole and Travis J. Cross.

He is an advocate for the expansion, development, and diversification of the wind repertoire and a supporter of music education in the schools. In his research and teaching, Kopczynski is especially interested in the intersection of experience and curriculum to influence ensemble culture. Passionate about teaching conducting and fostering the growth of music education at all levels, he developed and leads the annual Charlotte Band Directors Workshop and Conducting Symposium. He is an active adjudicator, clinician, and guest conductor, and has presented at state and regional music and music education conferences. His professional affiliations include the College Band Directors National Association, National Band Association, and the National Association for Music Education.
