Meet Our Director

Drew Carter

Drew Carter has been the director of the Charlotte Concert Band since the fall of 2012. He is also director of bands at Cox Mill High School in Concord. Previously, he was the band director at CC Griffin Middle School and assistant director of bands at Central Cabarrus High School.

Prior to his appointments in Cabarrus County, he held the position of Director of Bands at Chapel Hill High School in Chapel Hill, NC from 2005-2010. There, his responsibilities included directing the Concert Band, Symphonic Band, Percussion Ensemble, Jazz Band, Marching Band, and Pit Orchestra, in addition to overseeing the jazz combo program.

During his tenure at CHHS, the concert and marching bands, as well as the percussion ensemble, received numerous Superior ratings at District Music Performance Adjudication (MPA) events in Levels IV, V, and VI. The CHHS jazz program was honored at the 33rd Annual "Essentially Ellington" High School Jazz Festival at UNC in February 2010 as being the "Outstanding Jazz Band" and the "Outstanding Combo," receiving an invitation to perform with the acclaimed North Carolina Jazz Repertory Orchestra as a result.

Prior to teaching at CHHS, Mr. Carter was the Director of Bands at West Alexander Middle School in Taylorsville, NC from 2003-2005, where his teaching responsibilities included Beginning Band, Intermediate Band, Advanced Band, Jazz Band, and Percussion Ensemble. While in Alexander County, Mr. Carter remained an active performer with the Unifour Brass, the Hickory Choral Society, and the Lenoir-Rhyne Concert Band.

Mr. Carter received his Bachelor of Arts in Music (horn performance) from University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 2000. He received his Master of Arts in Teaching from UNC-CH in 2001. His professional affiliations include the National Association for Music Education, the North Carolina Music Educators Association, and the South Central District Bandmasters Association. His bands have twice performed at the NC Music Educators Association Convention: in 2015 (CCB) and in 2019 (JRMHS). He was inducted into the American School Band Directors Association (ASBDA) in 2017. He is married to his wonderful and supportive wife of seventeen years, Mandy, and they live in Cabarrus County with their sons, Van and Levi.

John Herlihy

John S. Herlihy (retired) served as Director of Bands and Assistant Professor of Music at the University of Northwestern-St. Paul in St. Paul, MN. His duties included conducting the University Symphonic Band, Jazz Ensemble, and Brass Choir, as well as teaching courses in Instrumental Conducting and Music Education. Prior to his appointment to UNW, Dr. Herlihy served as Supervisor of Performing Arts and Director of Bands at public high schools in Long Island, New York and southeastern Pennsylvania.

Dr. Herlihy holds a B.S. in Music Education from West Chester University of Pennsylvania, a M.S. in Music Education from Queens College CUNY, and a D.M.A in Music Education with a cognate in Conducting from the Mason Gross School of the Arts at Rutgers University in New Brunswick, New Jersey.



Johnathan Gunter

You don't have to watch Johnathan Gunter lead a band to know he's a passionate conductor. You only have to listen to the musicians he directs during a performance. "My idea is not to be that guy that stands up there and just waves his arms. I let my emotions and what I'm feeling come through in the way that I conduct and have that come through in the music," Gunter said. Johnathan previously served as assistant director under Julius Barkley with the Gaston Symphonic Band before assuming band leadership 12 years ago. "Some of the best band directors and musicians in our county have been in this band," he said. "I cherish the musical history of Gaston County and the opportunity to be a part of it as the director of the Gaston Symphonic Band." We are honored to have him as a player and conductor as he shares his time between both bands.



Spencer Hinson

Spencer Hinson has taught music in North Carolina Public Schools for seven years. Spencer graduated from Appalachian State University in 2013 where he received his Bachelors of Music Degree in Music Education. He has taught middle school and high school band and orchestra along with classes in music theory. He is a member of the National Band Association, National Association for Music Education, North Carolina Music Educators Association, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia.

From 2014-2018 Mr. Hinson served as the Director of Bands and Orchestras at Harnett Central High School in Lillington, NC. In 2016 his students performed his arrangement of the "Band World Premiere" of "Disneyana" by Robert Sherman Jr. This performance was a special request by Mr. Sherman Jr. to honor his late father's work when he was a prolific song writer and composer for Walt Disney. Mr. Hinson's students performed this premiere on Main Street USA in Magic Kingdom in Orlando, Florida.
